



Theme: Servant Leadership

Scripture: Matthew 20:26 (NIV)

"Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you

must be your servant."

Reflection

Servant leadership is a style of leadership that puts the needs and well-being of others first. It is not about being in control or seeking personal gain, but rather about serving those who look up to you. Reflection

Reflection

Reflection

Reflection

Scripture: Proverbs 3:31 (NIV)


"Do not envy the violent or choose any of their ways."

Reflection

Reflection

Scripture: 1 Peter 4:9 (NIV)


"Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling."

Reflection

Reflection

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 2:17 (NIV)


"Unlike so many, we do not peddle the word of God for profit. On the contrary, in Christ we speak before God with sincerity, as those sent from God."

Scripture: Titus 1:7 (NIV)


"Since an overseer manages God's household, he must be blameless—not overbearing, not quick-tempered, not given to drunkenness, not violent, not pursuing dishonest gain."

Reflection


Theme: Integrity

Zeal is an important quality for youth leaders to cultivate in



Reflection


Diligence is a virtue that every youth leader should strive to possess. It is the ability to be persistent and conscientious
